- Book Thief** by Markus Zusak
Audio and large print versions also available
Book set during WWII about nine year old orphan Liesel Meminger. Liesel shares stories with her neighbor Rudy and a Jewish fugitive her family is hiding.
- If Nobody Speaks of Remarkable Things** by Jon McGregor Booker nominated
Two converging stories about an accident on an English street. One is the story of the people who live on the street, and the second is the day as remembered by one of the residents.
- Isaac's Storm** by Erik Larson
Audio and large print versions also available
On September 8, 1900, a hurricane hit Galveston. Four feet of water flooded the town, while high winds destroyed thousands of buildings. As many as 10,000 people died as a result of the storm—giving it the title of America's worst natural disaster.
- Three Dog Life** by Abigail Thomas
Large print version also available
Essays about how the author changed her life after her husband sustains brain damage after being hit by a car. With her husband in an institution the author acquired two more dogs to keep her company.
- A Twist at the End** by Steven Saylor
Set in 1880's Austin, it's the story of Will Porter, aka O'Henry. This historical fiction includes real events such as the servant girl murders and numerous locals such as Elizabet Ney. Looks at racism and politics in post-Civil War Texas.
- The Worst Hard Time** by Timothy Egan National Book Award Winner
Audio version also available.
Tale of the families and communities devastated by the dust bowl that hit the plains in April 1935. The storm, stretching from the Dakotas to Texas whipped dry, over-farmed topsoil as far away as New York.
